Apocryphal Technologies


Technologies present themselves as the forward image of our desires, and these forward movements often keep us from sensing legitimate disappointment in them. The technological has always promised a great number of apocryphal benefits: from truth telling, to bodily enhancement, to cognitive amplification.

Often things that don't work simply must, as we've invested so much time, effort, emotion, belief and money in them. This rather legitimate disappointment is something we hide from ourselves and each other, making the technologies 'apocryphal': dubiously authentic, reliable, and functionally suspect. All thinking is speculative, and technologies absorb and condense this speculation, in particular as it intersects with 'spiritual' practices.

I would like to employ the word cyber crud to mean,in general, putting things over on people using computers. Cybercrud is one of the most important specialties, if not the economic backbone, of the computer field.

The promotion of false or clumsy approaches to a problem as "scientific," the frequent claim that "the computer has to have it that way"—when a certain thing could be programmed very differently—are cybercrud.








The Long Cybernetic Century

There are many ways of describing what cybernetics was. The most insightful for present purposes follows the conception of one of the leading English cyberneticians, Stafford Beer. Beer's basic starting point was explicitly ontological.

He insisted that the world was what he called 'an exceedingly complex system' (Beer 1959)—one which was impossible to know and control fully. So cybernetics began from de Kooning rather than Mondrian, acknowledging from the start that human detachment from and domination of the world is, at best, a fallible strategy. What was left for cybernetics, then, was a kind of engineering in the thick of things—the development of technologies that would be light on their feet, a form of adaptive engineering based upon open-ended forward looking searches through spaces of possibility that could not be exhaustively foreseen in advance.

Cybernetics' distinctive ontology fed into distinctive approaches in areas of human endeavour as various as brain science and artificial intelligence, robotics, information theory and theoretical biology, on the one side, and psychiatry, management, politics, the arts and spirituality on the other. Cybernetics thus showed that bringing to consciousness a decentred and temporalised ontology can make a big difference in the world, restructuring and reconfiguring great swathes of culture and practice—it was a nomad science.








Fig. I—The homeostat, with its four units, each one of which reacts on all the others.









Measuring the Body







Psychic Influences on the Galvanometer.

As soon as the test person is placed in the circuit and the experiment begins there is a rapid rise in the curve with some fluctuation, which we find due to expectant attention, a form of emotion. The extent of this expectation curve varies in different individuals, depending upon the degree of affectivity. In beginning an experiment, therefore, we waited until the effects of expectation had subsided and the galvanometer was stationary.

We employed first the following series of varied stimuli: sensory, verbal, strong, indifferent, intellectual, and emotional. Frequently the test person was in an adjoining room, at some distance from the recording apparatus, for electrical and signalling connexions for almost any distance can be readily adjusted.

CHAPTER VIII

GENESIS OF THE ELECTROPSYCHOMETER

In 1950 I obtained patents on what promised to be a valuable invention—a device to be used in motion—picture theaters to analyze continuously by electronic means the mixture of light frequencies in projection arc lamps, and thereby, through a warning buzzer signal, to enable the motion—picture projectionist to avoid the muddy, brown, or other off—color effects often noted on the motion—picture screen.


Many hundreds of these machines were ordered--then television swept upon the movie field like a hurricane. Business vanished. Orders for the "Arcon Monitor" were cancelled wholesale.

In a very upset state, I went to a psychoanalyst, seeking relief from nervous tensions. Not getting satisfactory results, I next attended a series of lectures being given by a very controversial figure, who several times emphasized that perhaps the major problem of psychotherapy was the difficulty of maintaining the communication of accurate or valid data from the patient to the therapist.





Now six back easily and think of a big, rusty nail! Think of stepping on it and the excruciating pain as it enters the tender flesh of your foot. . . .

If you're like most of humankind this image you conjure up will give a momentary flash of what is called in the vernacular the Screaming-Meemies. Indeed, your stomach may even break into a finale of the Ballet Russe. But, among the more erudite who flit about in the high ethereal reaches of Psychiatric theorizing, you are just experiencing a jolt and a jar at the loci of psychic trauma. If the image so upsets you that you hurry angrily out, hat in hand, to beat a hardware merchant about the head and shoulders the chances are that your loci is bigger than a water-melon and you ought to have it looked over.

Measuring the degree of psychic trauma is the function of a new machine called the "Electropsychometer" which was devised by Inventor Volney G. Mathison who is also active in psychoanalytical research. One day he set about designing a machine that would aid psychiatrists in measuring nervous reactions. First, he knew that when a person sees or feels or hears something unpleasant there is a spontaneous tightening of muscles. While this reaction is so finite that the person may not notice it, it can be measured. Similarly, a pleasant reaction causes a person to relax. So here was one human reaction which could be measured. Secondarily, the human skin is covered with approximately 400 sweat glands per square inch. On the thumbs and fingers, however, this rises to a dramatic 2700 per square inch. What is called the "psychogalvanic reflex" manifests itself in the jetting of droplets of saline fluid from subcutaneous glands. The sweat glands are closely allied with the autonomic nervous system and respond with extreme rapidity to nervous impulses originating in the autonomic nervous system. When a hand starts to clasp, for example, the jetting has already occurred.

The Chore. With these two basic facts

Mathison set to work. When the pilot model of his machine was built he started testing patients. The patient held two pads. The machine, delicately measuring muscular reaction, shows an upsurge on the dial when a question which was painful to the patient was asked. But the sweat gland measurement was still not so easily measurable. Mathison finally hit upon the simple idea of using an ordinary kitchen scouring pad for the patient to hold. The results were immediately satisfactory; the tiny fibers of metal measured the degree of "jetting" accurately and transmitted it to the machine.

A long series of tests began. The dial was adjusted to show pleasant and unpleasant reaction to questions. If there was a muscle-tightening and increased "jetting" it meant that the questioner had hit upon a painful subject. If there was relaxation it meant the patient found the question pleasing and soothing.

The dial registered, in effect, nervous tension. If a person is asked a question which is of no real concern to the patient the needle on the dial remains stationary. But, if the question is a painful one, the needle points toward a state of nervous tension and stays there. The "tone" of a patient is, also, measurable by the machine and the tone scale set up by Mathison runs from 4.0 (a healthy person in deep and dreamless sleep) to 1.0 (a state of acute physical and psychic disturbance). The "tone" scale measures the energy-consuming activity of the autonomic nervous system. It may be affected by such

things as external stimuli, the patient's bodily condition or complex mental-physical activity such as "feelings" and "thoughts." Mathison found that it takes time for each new patient to adjust to the machine and, only by some primary testing, could the accurate "tone scale"—or the rate of energy consumption—be ascertained. Once a patient became used to the machine and relaxed, the degree of tension could be judged. From that point on the reaction to questions becomes pertinent.

Application. The review of painful past events then begins. The studies include not only sexual situations, but also illnesses, frustrations, losses of beloved persons, and a vast variety of other injurious occurrences in the patient's life history.

It is also said that the instrument enables the therapist to avoid "running his own case" instead of the patient's case. In research, both patient and analyst are connected to two separate instruments, and Mathison observes both instruments. The analyst will often "hit the pin" in response to one of his own questions, while the patient's instrument may surge slightly, or not at all. This means that the area in review is more painful to the therapist than it is to the patient. Erroneous evaluations on the case are then inevitable, Mathison thinks, without instrumentation.

Also under research is a technique whereby differentiations between psychosomatic anxieties and actual organic illnesses apparently may be observed.






This is like the "Mark Five E-meter" (dynamic Ohm-meter or polygraph) in which some ex-Syndicate-Scientologist had the "courage" to replace the antique, 40-year-old transistors with modern Operational Amplifiers (OP AMPs), and he calculated the resistors around these, necessary to keep these semiconductor amplifiers within their range and desired amount of amplification. He put some silicium diodes around the microAmpere-meter in order to protect it.

The sensitivity and reliability of this polygraph (biofeedback meter) is much better than the 4,600 USD "Mark Super VII E-Meter". sold by the Scientology Syndicate. (If you want "Mark Super VII Quantum" then you increase the Body-shunt resistor of 22 kOhm. by a factor five or so, and adjust accordingly.)

The cost of THIS meter, which is better than the 4,600 USD meter, would be under 50 USD. (An extra needle-movement, of 100 milliAmpere for instance, can be added in parallel to the 100 microAmpere moving-coil meter to keep seeing bigger Reads that go "off the dial" of the 100 microAmpere-meter.) A simple analog multimeter (fast moving-coil with needle, or fast, fine bargraph) can be used easily if at hand.



The Adjust-knob ("Tone Arm") should be of large size. It has to be changed constantly and smoothly, also in very small amounts. (Someone might like to replace the Adjust-pot with a pot that moves several turns around, or might add such a pot.)

Contrary to some belief-systems, the sensitivity should be always set at the highest workable level. and may be adjusted frequently from high sensitivity to low, and back to high.





STABILIZED FEEDBACK AMPLIFIERS






Fig. 1—Amplifier system with feedback.






THE NEEDLE (assorted needle behaviours)

Stuck

The pre-clear would not even register being pinched

No reaction (null)

The question does not change the needle behaviour

Fall

A falling needle makes a dip to the right as you face the meter. A fall is a read. It denotes that a disagreement with life on which the pre clear has greater or lesser reality has met the question asked. A fall is the most used and observed needle action. It means to the auditor, "I've found it" or "I've gotten a response in the bank." It denotes that a disagreement with life on which pre clear has greater of lesser reality has met the question asked.

Tick

A tick is a small jerk of the needle that is really a tiny fall. Ticks are very important as they show a subject could be hot and could become a fall.

Stop

A question that instantly stops a rising or a falling needle means we have struck something. Further exploration may develop it into a fall.

Theta Bop

A theta bop is a small or wide steady dance of the needle. The needle goes up and down perhaps fie or ten times a second. It goes up, sticks, falls, sticks, goes up, sticks, etc., always the same distance, like a slow tuning fork. A thea bop means "death," "leaving," "don't want to be here." It is caused by a yo-yo of the pre clear as a theta vibrating out and into the body or a position in the body. It's like the needle is jumping between two peaks across a narrow valley.

Rock Slam

A rock slam is a crazy, irregular left-right slashing motion of the needle. It slams back and forth. A Rock Slam means a hidden eve intention on the subject or question under auditing discussion.

Dirty needle

A dirty need is an erratic agitation of the needle which is ragged, jerky, ticking, not sweeping and tends to be persistent. It is not limited in size. It is caused by the auditor breaking the auditor's code and the pre clear withholding something he or she does not wish known.

Free needle (floating needle)

You'll know one when you see one. They're really pretty startling. The needle just idles around the yawns at your questions on the subject. "Man it's really free."

Body reactions

The deep breathing of a pre clear, a sigh a yawn, a sneeze, a stomach growl can, any one of them, make a needle react

Scientology is a model control system, a state in fact with its own courts, police, rewards and penalties. It is based on a tight ingroup like the CJA, Islam, the Mormons, etc. Inside are the Rights with the Truth. Outside are the Commies, the Infidels, the Unfaithful, the Suppressives. Recently in America and for some time past in Russia telepathic experiments have been carried out on similar instruments. The Fall Read that characterizes fear, resistance, guilt, shame, can be produced from a distance by a sender who concentrates on persons or situations to which the receiver has a strong negative reaction. In short, auditing can be carried out telepathically from a distance so perhaps RON really audits you all.
